Assistance Programs for Nonprofits, Small Businesses and Other Organizations

Nonprofits and small businesses are especially vulnerable to the devastating effects of coronavirus (COVID-19). Below is a list of programs and organizations that offer disaster recovery loans and grants to help organizations continue their services and operations.

SMALL BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (SBA)

The SBA is offering targeted, low-interest disaster recovery loans to impacted businesses to help overcome temporary loss of revenue. Key points are:

- Available to qualifying small business who have no other access to credit and can only be used for qualifying expenses.
- Interest rates are 3.75% for small businesses and 2.75% for nonprofits.
- Long-term payment options up to 30 years and offered direct through SBA.

NYC COVID-19 RESPONSE AND IMPACT FUND*

Select foundations and philanthropies are making \$75 million in grants and no-interest loans to New York City nonprofits to fund a variety of activities, including:

- Unrestricted, flexible funding for emergency needs and community demands, including those that respond to social distancing, isolation and quarantine.
- Technology to support remote work and services.
- Temporary staff support to cover shortages caused by illness, quarantine or care-giving.
- Equipment and supplies such as masks, hand sanitizer, gloves and cleaning supplies.

NEW YORK CITY SMALL BUSINESS CONTINUITY FUND*

Small businesses in New York City impacted by the pandemic are eligible for interest free loans of up to \$75,000 for businesses that meet the following criteria:

- Located in one of the five boroughs of New York City
- Experienced at least a 25% decrease in revenues
- Employ less than 99 employees
- Do not have any outstanding tax liens or legal judgments
